PROCEEDINGS OF THE TWENTY-FIRST ANNUAL ENCAMPMENT DEPARTMENT OF KANSAS

SONS OF UNION VETERANS OF THE CIVIL WAR

January 28, 2017 Lawrence, Kansas

1. As required by Chapter II, Article III, Section 1 of the Regulations of the Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War and by Article VI, Bylaws of the Department of Kansas, SUVCW, the Twenty-First Annual Encampment of the Department of Kansas, was held on January 28, 20176, at the V.F.W., Lawrence, Kansas.

- 2. The Encampment was called to order at 10:00 AM by Department Commander Mark A. Britton. At that time, the Past Department Commanders in attendance were announced and filed into the room. A vacant chair remained in memory of PDC Dean K. Speaks and PDC Kenneth D. Strader.
- 3. Commander Britton received our honored guest, National Commander-in-Chief Donald Martin, Department of Ohio. Commander Martin gave a brief personal greeting to the Encampment.
- 4. At 10:15 AM, Commander Britton officially opened the encampment. The opening was conducted per the Rituals and Ceremonies of the Order.
- 5. Commander Britton then declared the Twenty-First Annual Encampment of the Department of Kansas, Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War, to be open for the transaction of such business as may legally and properly come before it.
- 6. The Department Secretary called the roll of officers, and reported all officers present:

Department Commander Mark A. Britton, PCC, Camp 1, present.

Senior Vice Department Commander William E. Fischer, Jr., PCC, Camp 9, present.

Junior Vice Department Commander Michael A. Todd, PCC, Camp 4, present.

Secretary/Treasurer and Counselor Alan L. Russ, PDC, Camp 16, present.

Council Member James R. Knopke, PDC, Camp 5, present.

Council Member William F. Riedell, Camp 1, present.

Council Member and Chaplain Roy A. Lafferty, Camp 4, present.

Patriotic Instructor K. Kirk Nystrom, Camp 16, present

Civil War Memorials Officer Douglas E. McGovern, PCC, Camp 1, absent.

Historian Blair D. Tarr, Camp 16, present

- 7. The Chaplain's prayer and the Pledge of Allegiance followed, and the Patriotic Instructor then led the Encampment in the signing of the Battle Hymn of the Republic.
- 8. At this time, the Secretary Russ presented the Credentials Committee report of those present at the Encampment. A quorum was declared to be present.
- 9. Commander Britton appointed PDC Alan L. Russ as Chairman of the Encampment Bylaws Committee, with PDC Rocky L. Bartlow and PDC Roy A. Lafferty as committee member.
- 10. Commander Britton appointed PCC William E. Fischer, Jr., as Chairman of the encampment Resolutions and Officers' Report Committee, with PDC James R. Knopke and PDC Kent M. Melcher as committee members.
- 11. Commander Britton informed the Encampment of "housekeeping rules" to be used during the meeting.
- 12. The Department Officer reports were presented by the officer and accepted by the Encampment as written. No recommendations were included in the reports.
- 13. The camp reports were presented and accepted by the Encampment as written. No recommendations were included in the reports.
- 14. Secretary Russ reported that official correspondence which had been received has previously been distributed to all officers and camp secretaries.
- 15. Commander Britton then called for Committee and other reports.
- 16. The following committee reports were presented:
 - a. Brother Alan L. Russ, Chairman of the Bylaws Committee Report, stated there were no recommended amendments acted upon.
 - b. The Vison committee report was presented by Commander Melcher.

- c. Nominating Committee Rocky L. Bartlow, PDC
- i. Brothers recommended by the Nominating Committee were placed into nomination for the respective office, with nominations from the floor to be taken later.
- ii. Commander Britton officially discharged the Nominating Committee with the "thank-you" of the Department.
 - d. PDC James R. Knopke, Department Council member, reported as to the satisfactory state of the funds of the Department.
- 17. At 11:45 PM, Commander Britton directed the Chaplain to close the Bible. Commander Britton then declared a recess for lunch. The Encampment was reconvened at 1 PM, moving to "New Business."
- 18. At 1:15 PM, Commander Britton again declared a brief recess so he, CinC Martin, and the other department officers could pay a visit to the Department of Kansas Ladies of the Grand Army of the Republic. The encampment was reconvened at 1:30 PM.
- 19. The Encampment Bylaws Committee reported there were no actions to consider.
- 20. The Encampment Resolutions and Officer Reports committee reported there were no actions to consider.
- 21. Commander Britton requested to know which past department commanders planned to attend the 2017 National Encampment in Lansing, Michigan. Commander Britton stated he would be attending in that status. PDC Lafferty and PDC Melcher stated they will be attending in his capacity as PDC.
- 22. Commander Britton stated the Department of Kansas was presumed to be entitled to six delegates to the National Encampment. The actual number will be determined when the annual report is filed in April. Commander Britton asked for nominations from the floor for the election of delegates to the 136th National Encampment. PDC Russ nominated the following to be delegates:
 - a. Conrad M. Fisher, Camp 16
 - b. Craig E. Dunston, Camp 16
 - c. Joshua S. Young, Camp 5
 - d. William F. Riedell, Camp 1
 - e. Ryan L. Todd, Camp 4
 - f. Michael Todd, Camp 4
- 23. The motion for election of delegates was seconded and approved. These brothers will be so indicated on the Form 49 submitted to National Headquarters.
- 24. Commander Britton recognized PDC Russ, who moved, "All Members and Associates of the Department of Kansas who are in good standing as of this date (January 28, 2017) and are not otherwise entitled to membership at the 136th National Encampment nor elected as a "Delegate" to the 136th National Encampment shall be elected as 'ALTERNATE DELEGATES' to the 136th National Encampment of the Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War, August 11-12, 2017, in Lansing, Michigan. A listing of those so elected as Alternate Delegates shall be included in the official proceedings of this encampment and shall be attached to the Department of Kansas Certificate of Election and Installation of Department Officers (SUVCW Form 49) and forwarded to the National Headquarters." Motion was seconded and passed.
- 25. Commander Britton announced that, per the Department Bylaws, the 22nd Annual Encampment of the Department of Kansas would be on January 13, 2018. Camp 5, Olathe, indicated it was willing to host the encampment.
- 26. Commander Britton stated the Department needed to establish the Department per capita for 2018. The current per capita is \$4.00. PCC Michael Todd moved the Department per capita remain at \$4.00 for 2018. Motion was seconded and passed.
- 27. There being no more new business to come before the Encampment, Commander Britton proceeded with the nominations and election of officers.
- 28. Commander Britton reminded the encampment that the brothers recommended by the Nominating Committee had been placed into nomination for their respective positions. Those nominated were:

- 29. There were no motions from the floor to nominate any additional candidates, nominations were closed. In accordance with Roberts Rules of Order¹, candidates for a position which was not contested were declared by Commander Britton as elected.
- 30. Commander Britton requested a motion from the floor to recognize and thank the V.F.W. for providing the meeting facilities. Kirk Nystrom, Camp 16, moved for the request. The motion was seconded and carried.
- 31. Commander Britton recognized Secretary Russ, who moved, "The proceedings of this encampment, upon approval by the voting members of the Department Council, and when signed by the outgoing Department Commander, shall be accepted as the official proceedings of the encampment, and be distributed to the camps of the Department." Motion was seconded and passed.
- 32. Commander Britton presented the following awards to the indicated recipients:
